## Re: Technical measures and the draft Implementing Act to Regulation 2019/1241 Statement from the Baltic Sea Advisory Council

Dear Ms Vitcheva,
Technical conservation measures for the fishery have been given the highest attention by the members of the BSAC since 2015.
This issue has been brought up again during recent meetings of the BSAC.
Members have highlighted problems with misinterpretation of existing technical rules in the Regulation 2019/1241 on the conservation of fisheries resources and the protection of marine ecosystems through technical measures. ${ }^{1}$
Members have also underlined the importance of discussing the technical measures in the context of the Commission's draft Implementing Act to the Regulation, which is currently under consultation with Member States only.

It was also pointed out by members that some draft provisions may lead to further misinterpretations of the existing technical rules.

The BSAC is anxious to get answers to outstanding questions.
Implementing rules that are simple, clear and easy to understand are crucial for the fishermen and for the fisheries inspectors to carry out their work.

The BSAC continues to offer its knowledge and expertise in clarifying the wording of these technical provisions.
We feel that this can best be done in an inclusive consultation process.

We regret that responsibility for the introduction of a legal act of such key importance for fishing in the Baltic Sea without consulting the fisheries sector will fall back on the Commission in terms of rules that are not fit for purpose.
